

Area Highlights

The Myron and Sonya Glassberg Family Conservation Area is located in northern Jefferson County. To reach the area, go south on Hwy 109 from I-44 in Eureka, then take Hwy FF west for 4.3 miles. The acquisition of this 634.4-acre tract was made possible through a donation from the Myron and Sonya Glassberg Family and the USDA Forest Service Forest Legacy Program. The property is located within the LaBarque Creek and Meramec Watersheds with soils derived from limestone and dolomite on the upper slopes and St. Peter Sandstone in the valleys. There is a variety of plant communities, including upland dolomite/limestone woodlands, limestone/dolomite and sandstone forests and bottomland forests along with old fields on the lower slopes. The woods are dominated by oaks, hickory, maple, and cedar with an understory of flowering dogwood and redbud.

Recreational Opportunities

Bird Watching – Hiking – Hunting –

This conservation area is closed from 10 p.m. to 4 a.m. except for authorized activities.

- No fireworks.
- No open fires.
- No camping or swimming is allowed.
- Bicycling and horseback riding are prohibited.
- No target shooting is allowed.
- Nuts, berries, fruits, mushrooms and wild greens may be taken for personal use.
- Dogs must be leashed when not used for training or hunting. Dog training is allowed by special-use permit only.
- Motor vehicles are allowed in parking areas only.
- No soil disturbance, digging, cutting or removal of other plants is allowed.
- No collection, destruction or defacing of any natural object is allowed.

Area Trails

The area offers a 3-mile loop hiking trail. The trail provides opportunities to visit a scenic overlook of the Meramec River.

Fishing

Fishing is allowed under statewide regulations with the following exceptions in impoundments:

- Seining or trapping live bait, including tadpoles, is prohibited. Gizzard shad may be taken from lakes and ponds by dip net or throw net.

Hunting and Trapping

Hunting is allowed under statewide regulations with the following exceptions:

- Firearms firing single projectiles are prohibited.
- Deer hunting is permitted under statewide seasons and limits except: only archery methods may be used. Deer hunting with firearms is prohibited.
- Only portable tree stands are allowed and only from Sept. 1 through Jan. 31. Unattended stands must be plainly labeled on a durable material with the full name and address, or Conservation Number, of the owner and be removed from the area before Feb. 1. Use of nails, screw-in steps, and any material or method that would damage the tree is prohibited.
- Furbearer trapping is permitted by special-use permit.
- Collection of any wildlife is prohibited.
- Bullfrogs and green frogs may not be taken with firearms.
- Hunters may not hunt on or within 100 feet of any trails, or roads open to vehicular traffic.

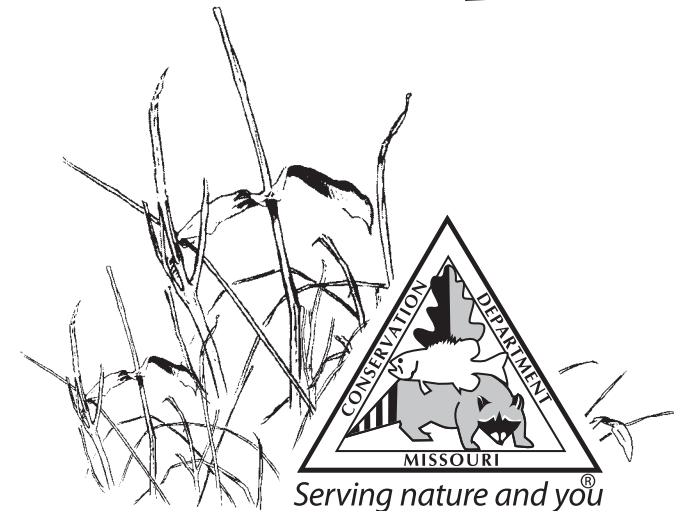
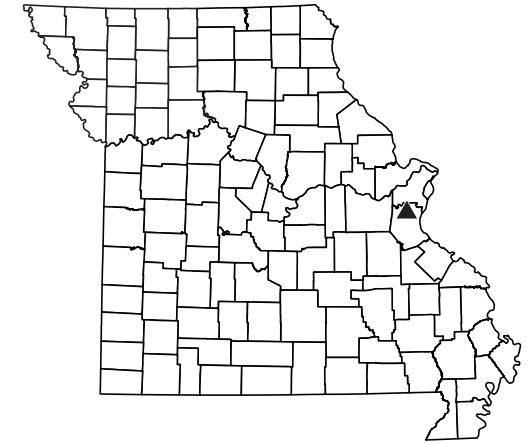
