RECREATIONAL OPPORTUNITIES

Bird Watching — Bicycling — Fishing Hiking — Hunting

Conservation Areas are closed from 10 p.m. to 4 a.m. except for authorized camping, fishing and hunting activities.

• Bicycling is allowed only on roads open to vehicles.

- Hiking is permitted on interior roads and trails.
- No camping permitted.
- Motor vehicles are allowed on public roadways and in parking areas.

• Nuts, berries, fruits, mushrooms and wild greens may be taken for personal use. Cutting or removing other vegetation is prohibited. Taking of wild greens from locations designated as Natural Areas is prohibited.

- Dogs must be leashed when not used for training or hunting.
- For safety reasons, no target shooting is allowed.
- Swimming and scuba diving are not allowed.

Fishing and Boating

Fishing and frogging are allowed under statewide regulations with the following exceptions:

• Boats may be used only for fishing and wildlife activities and may not be left unattended overnight.

Hunting and Trapping

Hunting is allowed under statewide regulations with the following exceptions:

- Deer and Turkey regulations are subject to annual changes. Please refer to Spring Turkey and Fall Deer and Turkey summaries for current regulations.
- Portable tree stands may be used between Sept. 1 and Jan. 31. Stands must be identified with the name and address, or conservation number, of the user. Screw-in steps or other materials that would damage the tree are prohibited.

• Decoys and portable blinds are permitted but must be removed from the area daily. Blinds may be constructed on-site, but only from willows and non-woody vegetation.

• Furbearer trapping is permitted by special use permit.


