- Horseback riding is not allowed on the area.
- · Camping is not allowed.
- Target shooting is not allowed.

About This Area

Owned by the Missouri Prairie Foundation and managed by the Missouri Department of Conservation. La Petite Gemme Prairie Conservation Area provides a good example of a remnant prairie. For that reason, the entire area has been designated as a Natural Area. Natural areas represent some of the best examples of our state's original landscape. Management activities include prescribed burning to maintain a diversity of plants and to inhibit competition from woody species. An abandoned railroad right-of-way that is part of the Frisco Highline Trail, which runs from Bolivar to Springfield, travels through the area. The Frisco Highline Trail is managed and maintained by Ozark Greenways.

There are no fishing opportunities on the area.

Hunting and Trapping

No hunting or trapping is allowed on the area.

From Bolivar, take South Springfield Avenue (Highway 83) south across Highway 13, then E 473rd Road (Evans Road) west about 1 mile.
