

Recreational Opportunities

Bird Watching – Fishing – Hiking – Hunting – Wildlife Viewing

Conservation Areas are closed from 10 pm to 4 am except for authorized camping, fishing and hunting activities.

- No littering.
- No fireworks.
- No open fires.
- No free-running pets. Dogs must be leashed or confined when not being trained or used for hunting.
- Destroying, cutting or removing vegetation is prohibited. Nuts, berries, fruits, mushrooms and wild greens may be taken for personal consumption only.
- Camping is permitted only in designated areas and is limited to 14 consecutive days in a 30-day period. Groups of 10 campers or more must obtain a special use permit.
- Motor vehicles are allowed only on graveled public roadways and parking areas unless otherwise posted.
- Bicycles, horses and horseback riding are permitted only on roads open to vehicular traffic.
- No target shooting allowed.
- Use or possession of lead shot is prohibited.
- Swimming, scuba diving, water skiing and sailboarding are not allowed.

Fishing and Boating

Fishing is permitted under statewide regulations.

The following special regulations also apply:

- On impounded waters, daily limits are six black bass and four catfish in the aggregate (channel, blue and flathead catfish) and 30 crappie. All other fish are not to exceed 20 in the aggregate. Pole and line methods only, not to exceed 3 poles per person.
- All black bass between 12 and 15 inches in total length must be returned to the water unharmed immediately after being caught.
- Bullfrogs and green frogs may be taken during the statewide season only by hand, handnet, atlatl, gig, bow, snagging, snaring, grabbing, pole and line, a twenty-two (.22) caliber or smaller rimfire rifle or pistol, pellet gun, or crossbow and only during dates and times when those waters are open to fishing or hunting.
- Seining or trapping live bait, including tadpoles, is

prohibited on all lakes and ponds.

- Boats may be used for fishing and wildlife-related activities only and may not be stored or left unattended overnight.

Hunting and Trapping

Area is open to hunting under statewide regulations. The following special regulations also apply:

- Use or possession of lead shot is prohibited.
- Deer and turkey regulations are subject to annual changes. Refer to the Spring Turkey or Fall Deer and Turkey booklets for current regulations.
- Trail and game cameras are prohibited.
- Only portable tree stands are allowed from Sept. 1 through Jan. 31. Unattended stands must be plainly labeled on a durable material with the full name and address, or Conservation Number, of the owner and be removed from the area before Feb. 1. Use of nails, screw-in steps, and any material or method that would damage the tree is prohibited.
- Decoys and portable blinds are permitted but must be removed from the area daily. Blinds may be constructed on-site, but only from willows and non-woody vegetation.
- Trapping of furbearers is permitted only as specifically authorized by special use permit.

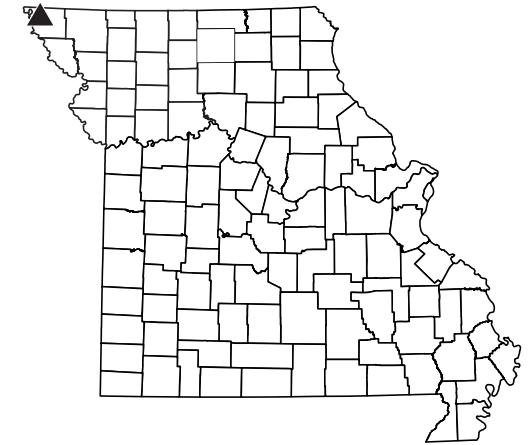
