

Recreational Opportunities

Hunting – Hiking – Nature Study –
Wildlife Viewing – Outdoor Photography

*Conservation Areas are closed from
10 p.m. to 4 a.m. except for authorized
hunting and dog training activities.*

- No littering.
- No fireworks.
- No open fires.
- Dogs must be leashed when not used for training or hunting.
- Nuts, berries, fruits, mushrooms, and wild greens may be taken for personal use. Cutting or removing other vegetation is prohibited.
- Camping is not allowed.
- Motor vehicles are allowed on public roadways and in parking areas.
- Target shooting is not allowed.

Fishing and Boating

*There are no fishing opportunities on
the area.*

Hunting and Trapping

*Hunting is allowed under statewide reg-
ulations with the following exceptions:*

- Deer and turkey regulations are subject to annual changes. Please refer to the Spring Turkey and Fall Deer and Turkey Hunting pamphlets for current regulations.
- Portable tree stands may be used between Sept. 1 and Jan. 31. Stands

must be identified with the name and address, or conservation number of the user. Screw-in steps or other materials that would damage the tree are prohibited.

- Furbearer trapping is permitted by special-use permit.

From the junction of Highway 32 and Route CC south of El Dorado Springs, take 821 Road south 2.5 miles, then 1400 Road west 1 mile.

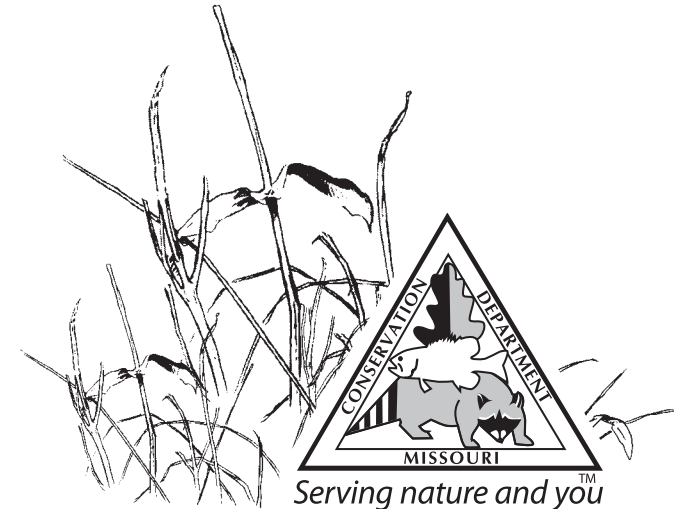
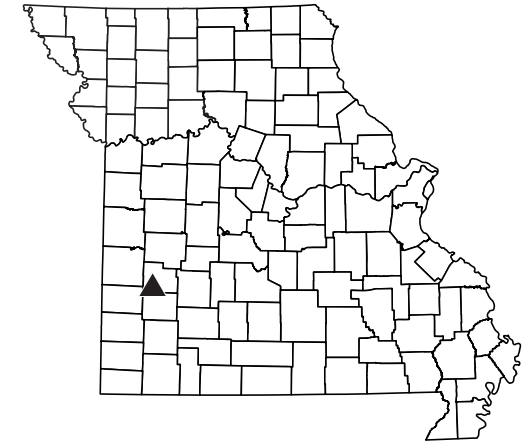
