

## Recreational Opportunities

Hunting – Bird Watching – Fishing – Outdoor Photography – Nature study and wildlife viewing – Canoeing – Bicycling

*Conservation Areas are closed from 10 p.m. to 4 a.m. except for authorized fishing, hunting, dog training, and launching and landing boats.*

- No littering.
- No fireworks.
- No open fires.
- Dogs must be leashed when not used for training or hunting.
- Nuts, berries, fruits, mushrooms, and wild greens may be taken for personal use. Cutting or removing other vegetation is prohibited.
- Motor vehicles are allowed on public roadways and in parking areas.
- Horseback riding is not allowed.
- Camping is not allowed.
- Bicycles allowed on designated service roads year-round. Service roads can be located at <https://mdc.mo.gov/discover-nature/places>
- Target shooting is not allowed.
- Swimming, scuba diving, water skiing, sailboarding, skateboarding, caving, and rappelling are not allowed.

## Fishing and Boating

*Fishing and frogging are allowed under statewide regulations with the following exceptions:*

- The section of the Niangua River flowing through Barclay Conservation Area is a White Ribbon Trout Stream. Daily limit of 4 trout. All brown trout less than 15 inches long must be immediately released unharmed back into the water. There is no length limit on rainbow trout. All types of lures and bait are allowed.

- Seining or trapping live bait, including tadpoles, is prohibited.
- Boats may not be left unattended overnight.
- In Ozark streams, black bass may not be possessed from March 1 through the Friday before the fourth Saturday in May.

## Hunting and Trapping

*Hunting is allowed under statewide regulations with the following exceptions.*

- Deer and turkey regulations are subject to annual changes. Please refer to the Spring Turkey or Fall Deer and Turkey Hunting pamphlets for current regulations.
- Portable tree stands may be used between Sept. 1 and Jan. 31. Stands must be identified with the name and address, or conservation number of the user. Screw-in steps or other materials that would damage the tree are prohibited.
- Furbearer trapping is permitted by special-use permit.

## Driving Directions

From Bennett Spring State Park, take Highway 64 west 3.7 miles, then Corkery Road north 3 miles, then Barclay Springs Road east.

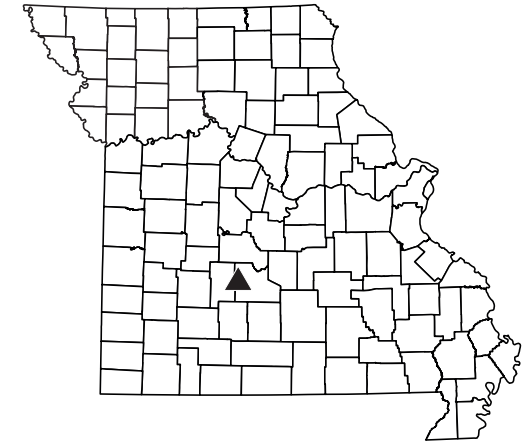
