Recreational Opportunities

Bird Watching – Bicycling – Fishing – Hiking – Horseback Riding – Hunting – Wildlife Viewing – Camping – Outdoor Photography

Conservation Areas are closed from 10 p.m. to 4 a.m. except for authorized camping, fishing, hunting, and dog training activities.

- No littering.
- No fireworks.

• Dogs must be leashed when not used for training or hunting.

• Nuts, berries, fruits, mushrooms, and wild greens may be taken for personal use. Cutting or removing other vegetation is prohibited.

• Primitive walk-in camping is allowed. Fires only allowed in campsites. Fires must be attended at all times and fully extinguished when vacating campsite. Groups of more than 10 need a specialuse permit.

• Hiking, bicycling, and horseback riding is allowed on designated multiuse trails. Multi-use trails open except during all portions of the firearms deer hunting season and during shooting hours of the spring turkey hunting seasons.

• For safety reasons, archery target shooting is permitted only at the shooting range.

• No firearms target shooting allowed.

Fishing and Boating

Fishing and frogging are allowed under statewide regulations with the following exceptions:

• Seining or trapping live bait, including tadpoles, is prohibited.

Hunting and Trapping

Hunting is allowed under statewide regulations with the following exceptions:

• Deer and turkey regulations are subject to annual changes. Please refer to the Spring Turkey or Fall Deer and Turkey Hunting pamphlets for current regulations.

• Portable tree stands may be used between Sept. 1 and Jan. 31. Stands must be identified with the name and address, or conservation number, of the user. Screw-in steps or other materials that would damage trees are prohibited. Stands must be removed by February 1st.

• Furbearer trapping is permitted by special-use permit.


