

RECREATIONAL OPPORTUNITIES

Bird watching – Hiking – Hunting – Outdoor photography – Wildlife Viewing

Conservation Areas are closed from 10 p.m. to 4 a.m. except for authorized camping, fishing and hunting activities.

- No horseback riding.
- No fireworks or open fires.
- No littering.
- Bicycling is allowed on service roads and roads open to vehicles.
- Dogs must be leashed.
- No camping permitted.
- Nuts, berries, fruits, mushrooms and wild greens may be taken for personal use. Cutting or removing other vegetation is prohibited. Taking of wild greens from locations designated as Natural Areas is prohibited.
- Motor vehicles are allowed on public roadways and in parking areas. No All-Terrain Vehicles (ATV) are permitted on the area.
- Hiking is permitted on interior roads and trails.
- For safety reasons target shooting is not permitted.
- Swimming, scuba diving, skateboarding, caving and rappelling are not allowed.

Fishing and Boating

Fishing and frogging are allowed under statewide regulations with the following exceptions on impoundments:

- Daily limit is 6 black bass, 4 catfish (channel, blue, and flathead combined) and 30 crappie. Total number of all other fish may not exceed 20.
- All black bass between 12 and 15 inches must be returned to the water unharmed immediately after being caught.
- Fish may be taken only by pole and line and not more than 3 poles may be used by any person.
- Seining or trapping live bait, including tadpoles, is prohibited.

Hunting and Trapping

Hunting is allowed under statewide regulations with the following exceptions:

- Ball Mill Natural Area is closed to hunting.
- Deer and turkey regulations are subject to annual changes. Please refer to Spring Turkey and Fall Deer and Turkey summaries for current regulations.
- Portable tree stands may only be used between Sept. 1 and Jan. 31. Stands must be identified with the name and address, or conservation number, of the user. Screw-in steps or other materials that would damage the tree are prohibited.
- Decoys and portable blinds are permitted but must be removed from the area daily. Blinds may be constructed on-site, but only from willows and non-woody vegetation.
- Furbearer trapping is permitted by special use permit.
- Use or possession of lead shot is prohibited for hunting doves on this area.

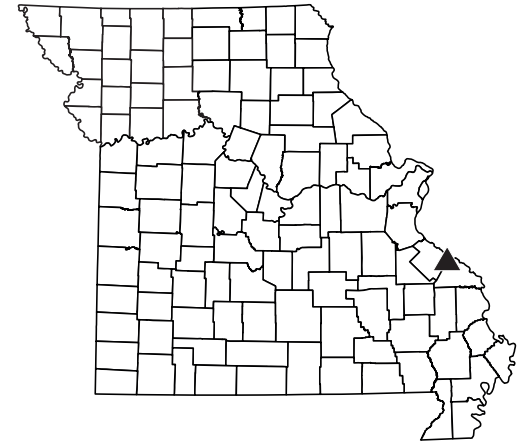
