

Recreational Opportunities

Bird Watching – Bicycling – Fishing – Hiking – Horseback Riding – Hunting – Outdoor Photography
Conservation Areas are closed from 10:00 pm to 4:00 am except for authorized camping, fishing and hunting activities.

- No littering. No fireworks. No open fires except in designated camping areas.
- No free-running pets. Dogs must be leashed or confined when not being trained or used for hunting. A valid small game hunting permit is required to train dogs in pursuit of wildlife.
- Groups of 10 people or more must obtain a special-use permit.
- Destroying, cutting or removing vegetation is prohibited. Nuts, berries, fruits, mushrooms and wild greens may be taken for personal consumption only.
- Vehicle use is restricted to graveled and paved roads and established parking areas unless otherwise posted.
- Camping is permitted only in designated areas and is limited to 14 consecutive days in a 30-day period.
- Bicycles and horses allowed on multi-use trails and bicycles allowed on designated service roads year-round. Multi-use trails and service roads (if any) can be located at <https://mdc.mo.gov/discover-nature/places>
- No target shooting allowed.
- Swimming, scuba diving, water skiing, sailboarding, skateboarding, caving and rappelling are not allowed.

Fishing and Boating:

Fishing is permitted under statewide regulations. The following special regulations also apply.

- On Mussel Fork Creek, black bass less than 12 inches in total length and on area ponds all bass between 12 and 15 inches in total length must be returned to the water unharmed immediately after being caught.
- On area ponds, only poles or rods with attached lines may be used and not more than three poles or rods may be used by one person.
- Area pond daily limits are 6 black bass, 4 catfish, and 30 crappie. All other fish fall under statewide limits but not to exceed 20 in the aggregate.
- Mussel Fork Creek daily limits are 6 black bass, 10 channel catfish, 5 flathead catfish, 5 blue catfish,

and 30 crappie. See the Wildlife Code for a complete listing of other species and limits.

- Regardless of where taken, no fish less than the specified minimum length limit shall be possessed on the waters to which length limits apply.
- Bullfrogs and green frogs may be taken during the statewide season only by hand, handnet, atlatl, gig, bow, snagging, snaring, grabbing, pole and line, a twenty-two (.22) caliber or smaller rimfire rifle or pistol, pellet gun, or crossbow, only on waters and within dates and hours those waters are open to fishing or hunting.
- Seining or trapping live bait, including tadpoles, is prohibited on all lakes and ponds.
- Boats may be used for fishing and wildlife-related activities only and may not be stored or left unattended overnight.
- Electric motors only are allowed on area ponds. No motor restrictions apply on Mussel Fork Creek.

Hunting and Trapping:

Area is open to hunting under statewide regulations. The following special regulations also apply.

- Deer and turkey regulations are subject to annual changes. Refer to Spring Turkey or Fall Deer and Turkey booklets for current regulations.
- Only portable tree stands are allowed and only from Sept. 1 through Jan. 31. Unattended stands must be plainly labeled on a durable material with the full name and address, or Conservation Number, of the owner and be removed from the area before Feb.
 1. Use of nails, screw-in steps, and any material or method that would damage the tree is prohibited.
- Trail and game cameras are prohibited.
- Trapping of furbearers is permitted only as specifically authorized by special use permit.

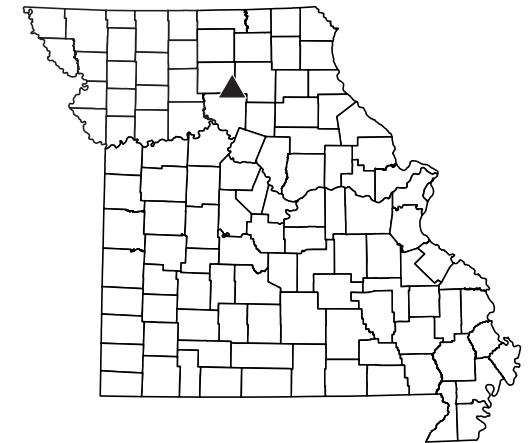
