

## Hunting and Trapping

Area is open to statewide regulations. The following special regulations also apply.

- Deer and turkey regulations are subject to annual changes. Please refer to Spring Turkey or Fall Deer and Turkey Booklets for current regulations.
- Waterfowl hunting is prohibited from October 15 through the end of the current waterfowl season on the lands and waters of the main arm of Thomas Hill Lake between Highway T and Ginger Street (Three and one-half miles north of Highway T). The following special regulations also apply:
- Only portable stands are allowed from September 1 through January 31. Unattended stands must be plainly labeled on a durable material with the full name and address or Conservation number of the owner and be removed from the area by February 1st. Use of nails, screw-in steps, and any material or method that would damage the tree is prohibited.
- Decoys and blinds are permitted but must be disassembled and removed daily. Blinds may be constructed on-site, but only from willows and non-woody vegetation.
- Trapping of furbearers allowed only with special use permit. Contact area manager.
- Trail and game cameras are prohibited.

## Recreational Opportunities

Wildlife Viewing– Bird Watching – Hiking

*Conservation Areas are open from 4:00 a.m. to 10:00 p.m.; hunting, fishing, trapping, camping, dog training, launching and landing boats allowed 24 hours a day on areas where these activities are permitted. Parking or storing watercraft or commercial vehicles on department areas during closed hours is prohibited.*

- Any activity with groups of 10 or more need a special use permit. Contact area manager.
- Guiding for pay is prohibited.
- Use of fireworks are prohibited.
- Nuts, berries, fruits, edible wild greens and mushrooms may be taken only for personal consumption. Digging of roots is prohibited.
- No bicycling or horseback riding opportunities except on public roadways.
- Vehicles are only permitted on public roadways and in parking lots.
- Camping is permitted only at the Highway T campground. Camping is permitted only at numbered campsites and is limited to 14 consecutive days in a 30-day period. All personal property must be removed from the area at the end of the 14-day period.
- Numbered campsites are limited to one camping or sleeping unit per site. A maximum number of 6 people are permitted in each campsite. All visitors not occupying a campsite must leave the campground by 10 p.m.
- Quiet hours are in effect from 10 p.m. to 6 a.m. daily. Quiet hours are defined as the cessation of excessive noise from people or any mechanical device that causes disturbance to other campers.
- Field trials prohibited.

- Pets and hunting dogs are permitted but must be on a leash or confined at all time. Hunting dogs may be used off the leash and unconfined for hunting and training purposes. Hunting permit required to train dogs in pursuit of wildlife.
- Target shooting is not allowed.

## Fishing and Boating

*Fishing is permitted under statewide regulations. The following special regulations also apply.*

- On Thomas Hill Lake, all largemouth bass less than 15 inches and all hybrid striped bass less than 20 inches in total length must be returned to the water unharmed immediately after being caught.
- In area ponds and strip pits, all largemouth bass between 12 and 15 inches in total length must be returned to the water unharmed immediately after being caught.
- Total length is measured from the tip of the snout to the end of the tail, with the fish laid flat, the mouth closed and the tail lobes pressed together.
- On area ponds and strip pits only poles or rods with attached lines may be used, and not more than three poles or rods may be used by any one person.
- Daily Creel limits are:

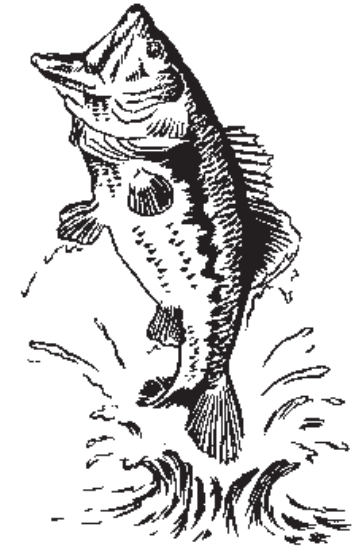

- Fish caught in area ponds and strip pits may not be possessed on Thomas Hill Lake and vice versa.
- Seining or trapping live bait, including tadpoles, is prohibited on all area ponds and their discharge channels.
- Salvage seining of non-game fish for personal use is permitted only with written permission of the Conservation Department.
- Boating is permitted on Thomas Hill Lake. Water skiing is prohibited north of Highway T on the Stinking Creek arm of the lake, and on the warm-water arm upstream of the marker buoys. No horsepower restrictions apply.
- All boating is prohibited on the main arm of the lake north of Highway T from October 15 through January 15.
- On area ponds and strip pits electric motors only are permitted.
