

RECREATIONAL OPPORTUNITIES

Bird Watching — Bicycling — Fishing

Wildlife Viewing

Conservation Areas are closed from 10 p.m. to 4 a.m. except for authorized camping, fishing and hunting activities.

- Horseback riding is allowed on roads open to vehicles.
- Bicycling is allowed on roads open to vehicles.
- Hiking is permitted on interior roads and trails.
- No camping is permitted.
- Motor vehicles are allowed on public roadways and in parking areas.
- Destroying, cutting or removing vegetation is prohibited. Nuts, berries, fruits, mushrooms and wild greens may be taken for personal consumption only.
- Dogs must be leashed when not used for training or hunting.
- Archery target shooting is permitted only on designated public shooting ranges.

Fishing and Boating

Fishing and frogging are allowed under statewide regulations with the following exceptions:

- Fish may be taken only by pole and line and not more than 3 poles may be used by any person.
- All black bass less than 15 inches must be returned to the water unharmed immediately after being caught.
- All white bass, striped bass, and their hybrids less than 20 inches must be returned to the water unharmed immediately after being caught.
- Daily limits are: 4 catfish (includes channel, blue and flathead), 6 black bass, 4 white bass, striped bass and their hybrids, 30 crappie and not more than 20 of all other fish combined.

- Bullfrogs and green frogs may be taken during the statewide season by hand, handnet, gig, longbow or hook and line and only on waters open to fishing except firearms may not be used.
- Salvage seining of non-game fish for personal use is permitted only with written authorization.
- Boats may be used only for fishing and wildlife-related activities and may not be left unattended overnight.
- Outboard motors in excess of 10 horsepower must be operated at no-wake speed.

Hunting and Trapping

- Area is closed to hunting.
- Furbearer trapping is permitted by special use permit.

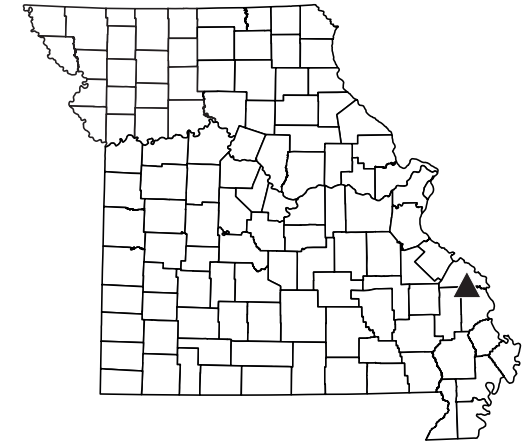
