

RECREATIONAL OPPORTUNITIES

Archery Range — Bird Watching — Fishing
Hiking — Hunting — Outdoor Photography—
Wildlife Viewing

Conservation Areas are closed from 10 p.m. to 4 a.m. except for authorized camping, fishing and hunting activities.

- No horseback riding.
- No fireworks or open fires.
- Dogs must be leashed when not used for training or hunting.
- Special use permits are required for field and retriever trials.
- Nuts, berries, fruits, mushrooms and wild greens may be taken for personal use. Cutting or removing other vegetation is prohibited.
- Motor vehicles are allowed on public roadways and in parking areas.
- Camping permitted only in designated areas.
- Archery target shooting is only allowed on archery range.
- Swimming is not allowed.

Fishing and Boating

Fishing and frogging are allowed under statewide regulations with the following exceptions:

- Fishing is permitted under statewide regulations, except on impounded waters closed by posting.
- Daily limit is 6 black bass, 4 catfish (channel, blue and flathead combined) and 30 crappie. Total number of all other fish may not exceed 20.
- All black bass between 12 and 15 inches must be released immediately after being caught.
- Seining or trapping live bait, including tadpoles, is prohibited.
- Boats may be used only for fishing and wildlife activities and may not be left unattended overnight.
- Only electric motors are permitted.

Hunting and Trapping

Hunting is allowed under statewide regulations with the following exceptions:

- All small game hunters must obtain an area daily hunting permit at a self-check box located at the parking lots prior to hunting. Hunters must carry this card while hunting and return filled out card to one of the self-check boxes when done hunting. Deer and turkey hunters do not need to complete a daily hunting permit.
- Deer and Turkey regulations are subject to annual changes. Please refer to Spring Turkey and Fall Deer and Turkey summaries for current regulations.
- Portable tree stands may be used and only between Sept. 1 and Jan. 31. Stands must be identified with the name and address, or conservation number, of the user. Screw-in steps or other materials that would damage the tree are prohibited.
- Decoys and portable blinds are permitted but must be removed from the area daily. Blinds may be constructed on-site, but only from willows and non-woody vegetation.
- Furbearer trapping is permitted by special use permit.
- Hunting is not allowed inside the archery range perimeter.

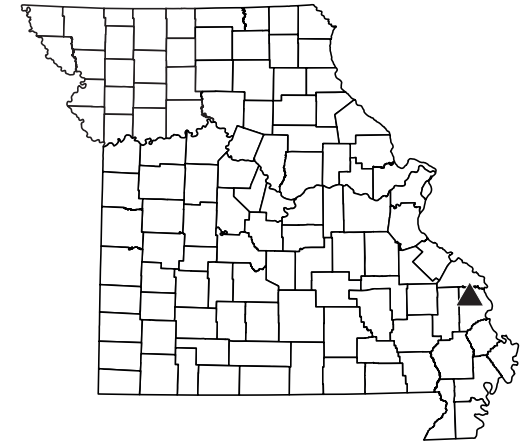
