

Old Bethany City Lake

About This Area

Close-to-home fishing is an accurate description for this 16-acre water supply lake. The lake is located inside Bethany's city limits and is ideal for families to bring kids who want to "wet a line." According to local residents Old Bethany Reservoir was built in the 1930s by WPA labor using horse drawn scrapers. The lake is surrounded by park land and a golf course.

Since the lake was enrolled in the Community Assistance Program, the Missouri Conservation Department has added a disabled user accessible parking lot and restrooms. Anglers with disabilities have access to the lake by way of a paved trail. The City of Bethany has added a gravel boat ramp.

Channel catfish are stocked periodically by the Conservation Department. Anglers of all ages should enjoy an active afternoon of fishing at this lake. Non anglers can enjoy picnicking, nature viewing or bird watching.

Hunting and trapping prohibited.

Black bass	6	15"
Channel catfish	4	None
Crappie	30	None
All other fish combined	20	None

- Only pole and line fishing (3 per person).
- Bullfrogs and green frogs may be taken during the statewide season by hand, handnet, gig, long-bow or hook and line.
- No swimming.
- Vehicles on roadways and parking areas only.
- Electric boat motors only.

The Community Assistance Program sponsored by the Missouri Conservation Department provides fisheries management and assistance to local communities for developing or upgrading facilities. In return, local communities maintain the area and facilities and open their lakes to the public. This program provides fishing and improved facilities at lakes close to home. Everyone benefits.

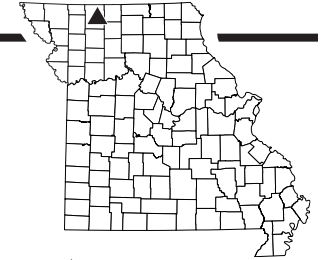
