

Recreational Opportunities

Hunting - Hiking - Nature study and wildlife viewing - Outdoor Photography

Conservation Areas are closed from 10 p.m. to 4 a.m. except for authorized hunting activities.

- No littering.
- No fireworks.
- No open fires.
- Dogs must be leashed when not used for training or hunting.
- Nuts, berries, fruits, mushrooms and wild greens may be taken for personal consumption only. Cutting or removing other vegetation is prohibited.
- Motor vehicles are allowed on public roadways and in parking areas.
- Horseback riding is not allowed.
- Camping is not allowed.
- Target shooting is not allowed.
- Bicycling is not allowed.

Fishing and Boating

There are no fishing opportunities on the area.

Hunting and Trapping

Hunting is allowed under statewide regulations with the following exceptions:

- Deer and turkey regulations are subject to annual changes. Please refer to the Spring Turkey or Fall Deer and Turkey Hunting pamphlets for current regulations.
- Portable tree stands are allowed between Sept. 1 and Jan. 31. Unattended stands must be plainly labeled with the full name and address, or conservation number of the owner and be removed before Feb. 1. Screw-in steps or other materials that would damage the tree are prohibited.

From Pittsburg, take Highway 64 south 4 miles, then County Road 328 west 1 mile, then turn north, the road becomes County Road 167. Take County Road 167 north about 0.75 mile, then turn west on County Road 320. This road turns into County Road 163 for about 0.5 mile. Continue on County Road 163 for about 0.5 mile to where it becomes County Road 325. Go about 0.25 mile to the area welcome sign.

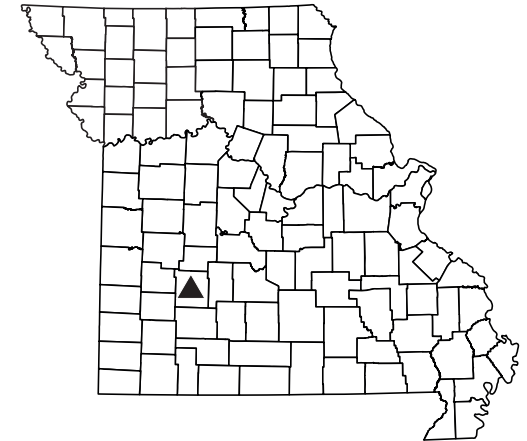
